## From the Minister

**Dear friends,**

I write this after a day having conducted services in all three churches in the pastorate the last of which involved a pleasant journey to Bewcastle. Looking at the grassy banks covered with snowdrops was a welcome relief from icy roads. Signs of spring are all around us with other bulbs beginning to show through. Spring of course in the Church Calendar means the run up through Lent to Holy Week and On the 3rd of March we reach Transfiguration Sunday and reflect on God's glory and Luke's Gospel emphasises particularly the importance of Prayer.

On the 10th of March is the first Sunday of Lent. Luke in Chapter 4 reflects on how after his Baptism Jesus went into the wilderness as part of his training for future ministry. The sparring with the devil toughened him up for the future. The second Sunday of Lent on the 17th sees us studying Luke 13 and how Jesus dismissed earthly pressures to give up his God given task. The Third Sunday of lent on 24th March sees us thinking about a perennial problem in Luke 13 and that is human suffering. Finally we reach on the 31st of March Mothering Sunday and the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

Lent I find is a very useful time to reflect on our personal relationship with God and how we might improve it. Fortunately in the Pastorate if you feel that you need your spiritual mind stimulating during Lent outside of normal Services there are a number of special lent meetings taking place which are listed later in this Newsletter.

As we transform as three Churches from expecting new people to come to us and instead gain the courage to go out and meet people where they are, it does seem a really sensible idea to emulate Jesus and think about how we can effect radical change, by setting aside time in Lent to challenge our own inhibitions about going out, rather than relying on welcoming those folk who choose to seek us out.

The activities that we have done already show us that meeting people outside our own communities is not half as hard as we thought and that sharing our faith with others actually strengthens our own faith.

We are in challenging times and there are great opportunities open to us because so many are seeking certainty from something. They seek it because many of the rocks that they have depended on are seemingly crumbling around them. The message of Jesus Christ as our Saviour is a wonderful message to pass on and great joy can be had from sharing our joy as Christians with non-believers. The Gospel of Christ is a certainty that is not crumbling. It is a message that comes with help for through Prayer we can let the Holy Spirit guide us through the times of test and trial we all face in our daily lives.

Lent doesn't have to be a time of deep depression because we believe as Christians that Christ suffered for us but through death and Resurrection God won through to save the human race.

## **Mission Community Update**

Bewcastle URC will form part of an interesting Mission Community which will include not only Bewcastle Parish Church but also the Anglican Churches in the Longtown group, the Church of Scotland at Longtown and the Methodist Church at Longtown. This Mission Community will hopefully begin to develop now Rev Brett Murphy has been appointed.

Brampton's Mission Community will soon hopefully be able to form because on Thursday 14th February four candidates were being interviewed for the post of Mission Community Leader. Joint activities between the Churches are already happening. A very successful Quiz Night was held in the Green Door Hall on the 8th of February raising just over £230 for this mission project. Also the URC will be hosting an Ecumenical Lent Course led by retired Bishop Peter of Brampton on a world Church theme involving Mission.

St George's URC Carlisle continues to support enthusiastically the fledging City Centre Mission Community and the draft mission agreement has been approved by Anglican, Methodist, Salvation Army and ourselves and further progress was due to be made at the meeting on 12th February. Full details of that meeting will appear in our next issue of the Newsletter.

All the Churches are involved in planning for Bishop James' walk during Lent round Cumbria. There is to be a big Mission Community Event at Rheged on the 1st of March.

### **Pastorate Service 31st March**







## Zimbabwe

### *Village banks help to build small businesses*

In Masendu, change is happening. In this district of southern Zimbabwe, near the border with Botswana, the villages are remote; with limited access to markets and banks, running a business is difficult. Now, one of Christian Aid's partners is making it easier to become a business owner.

### *From savings and loans to village banks*

Many women in the villages around Masendu have long been members of a savings and loans group. This was a success for them, but they could only lend small amounts, and only within the group. Now, the Institute for Rural Technologies (IRT) has backed their skills - and trained them to run a village bank.

With a starter fund of \$3,000, the bank lends money to local people to help them start businesses. The bank's founders have learned what makes a good business plan; they know how to make loan decisions and how to monitor the business. If someone defaults, the traditional courts of the village decide whether it was due to unexpected circumstances (and the loan is written off) or lack of effort - in which case the person must repay the amount through community work.

Because access to cash is a problem in Zimbabwe, IRT has helped to provide mobile banking kiosks so that running a business doesn't mean a long journey to the local town.

### *Chickens, guinea fowl and a borehole*

Sikhanyisiwe Ndlovu's journey to being a businesswoman has been hard. As a widow with three children, Sikhanyisiwe struggled to pay for food and school fees. She saw other women starting projects through loans from the village bank and decided to try it herself.

Raising chickens allows Sikhanyisiwe to have an income every six weeks. She has branched out into rearing guinea fowl which roam around her homestead. It's a smart choice - guinea fowl need less water than chickens.

*"In Masendu, water is a big challenge. During the dry season most people wake up at 4am to fetch water. There are huge queues. Some people come back from the water points after 10am, having gone there at 5am."*

With another small loan, and some money from selling grain, Sikhanyisiwe now has her own borehole. It has allowed her to start a market garden, grow more crops and keep some goats.

The income from these businesses has enabled Sikhanyisiwe to send her daughters to school so they can complete their secondary education - something which is unusual in Masendu. Providing food for the family is no longer the challenge it was.

## Reflection

This reflection on Christ's Transfiguration, written by Revd Jo Clare-Young, a URC minister in the North Yorkshire Coast Pastorate, comes from the URC's Daily Devotions. It seems particularly relevant to us as we face big changes in more than one aspect of our lives.

I sometimes wonder if we shy away from the Transfiguration a little; a mystical event on a mountainside, Moses and Elijah, dazzling glory, a cloud and the voice of God. It's a lot to process; all this glory, the glory of Christ. Yet there beside the glory is the reminder of the Cross, the humanity, the sacrifice, the promise.

Hills and mountains are so often places of encounter with God. This is the story of a moment; a moment linked to the past and the future by its location on a mountain. We are reminded of other 'mountain moments' by Moses and Elijah both of whom encountered God on a mountainside. We are rooted in the past but we are also pointed towards a future hillside and Jesus's departure. When we think about God as outside of time it can change our perspective on events in our own lives.

We are located within our own stories, we are rooted within our own past; we are heading towards our own future. We can remember the past, give thanks for it, take our lessons from it, but at the same time we need to look forward. We need to look to the future and to God's promises.


We should help our churches do the same. To celebrate what has gone before, to celebrate what is happening now but, most importantly, to look to the future. It is easy to understand how Peter felt; awed by the appearance of Moses and Elijah, the vision of Jesus dressed in dazzling white. It is easy, perhaps, to understand why he wanted to build three dwellings and to stay on the mountain. That wasn't the future God had planned for him; it was not what Christ was calling him to. Like Peter we are called to go out into the world, to leave our dwellings, our churches, and to shine with the dazzling hope of Christ for the people we meet.

## Prayer

Dazzling Christ, we give thanks for that which has gone before, for the people and communities that have made up our past. We give thanks for what is to come, for those we will meet and journey with. May we shine with your promise and hope for them. Amen


