From the Minister


Christmas Card Box

Children of Gaza Crisis Appeal

After over 100 days of violence, children in Gaza face a lethal triple threat: disease from lack of clean water, malnutrition from food shortages and death from bombardment. **UNICEF** continues to call for a ceasefire and for safe, expanded access to deliver more emergency supplies to tackle this critical situation.

Clean water and sanitation: Continued denial of provision of fuel for water and sanitation facilities in the Gaza Strip, has left children and families without access to clean water. In response to this urgent need, we've provided fuel to power water wells and desalination plants producing clean water, reaching over 1.3 million people including



670,000 children. But with restricted access, fuel shortage continues to be a critical issue creating severely disrupted water supplies.

Health and nutrition: Gaza's food and health systems are facing complete collapse. Up to 90% of children under two are subject to severe food poverty, and in just one week cases of diarrhoea in children went up by 50%. Also in just one week UNICEF supplied medical kits and supplementary foods for 55,000 people. We've also provided diarrhoea kits to prevent and respond to the growing number of diarrhoea cases.

Supplies and ceasefire: Our teams are working tirelessly to bring in more supplies, however access remains a challenge and resources are dangerously low. Recently an average of just 129 trucks a day were cleared for entry resulting in vital resources becoming dangerously low. We are calling for an immediate and long-lasting ceasefire as well as secure and unrestricted humanitarian access and the safe and unconditional release of any children being held hostage.
